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## SECTION 5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

- Suitable extinguishing media : Use extinguishing measures that are appropriate to local circumstances and the surrounding environment.  
Use water spray, alcohol-resistant foam, dry chemical or carbon dioxide.
- Unsuitable extinguishing media : None known.
- Specific hazards during fire fighting : Olefin containing sulfurized products may decompose under certain conditions and release Trimethylpentene.  
In a fire or if heated, a pressure increase will occur and the container may burst.  
Cool closed containers exposed to fire with water spray.
- Further information : Promptly isolate the scene by removing all persons from the vicinity of the incident if there is a fire.  
No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training.
- Special protective equipment for fire-fighters : Fire-fighters should wear appropriate protective equipment and self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA) with a full face-piece operated in positive pressure mode.

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## SECTION 6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

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- Personal precautions, protective equipment and emergency procedures : No action shall be taken involving any personal risk or without suitable training.  
Put on appropriate personal protection equipment.  
Do not touch or walk through spilled material.  
Evacuate personnel to safe areas.  
Keep unnecessary and unprotected personnel from entering.
- Environmental precautions : Avoid dispersal of spilled material and runoff and contact with soil, waterways, drains and sewers.  
Local authorities should be advised if significant spillages cannot be contained.
- Methods and materials for containment and cleaning up : Stop leak if safe to do so.  
Move containers from spill area.  
Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows.  
Contain spillage, soak up with non-combustible absorbent material, (e.g. sand, earth, diatomaceous earth, vermiculite) and transfer to a container for disposal according to local / national regulations (see section 13).  
Dispose of wastes in an approved waste disposal facility.  
Do not allow into the sewerage system, surface waters or groundwater or into the soil.

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### SECTION 7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

- Technical measures : Ensure that eyewash stations and safety showers are close to the workstation location.
- Advice on safe handling : Olefin containing sulfurized products may decompose under certain conditions and release Trimethylpentene. Trimethylpentene can be released during distillations. Distillation in plants with solvent recovery (e.g. degreasing/solvent cleansing plants) may lead to Trimethylpentene accumulation in the solvent circuit, if fractional distillation is not performed.  
Remove contaminated clothing and protective equipment before entering eating areas.  
Workers should wash hands and face before eating, drinking and smoking.  
Put on appropriate personal protection equipment.  
Eating, drinking and smoking should be prohibited in areas where this material is handled, stored and processed.
- Conditions for safe storage : Store in accordance with local regulations.  
Store in original container protected from direct sunlight in a dry, cool and well-ventilated area, away from incompatible materials (see Section 10) and food and drink.  
Keep container closed when not in use.  
Containers that have been opened must be carefully resealed

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and kept upright to prevent leakage.  
Do not store in unlabeled containers.  
Use appropriate container to avoid environmental contamination.

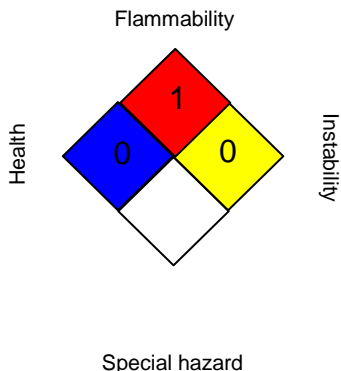
