INTRODUCTION

EBECRYL 3700-25R is the bisphenol A epoxy diacrylate, EBECRYL 3700, diluted 25% by weight with the reactive diluent tripropylene glycol diacrylate (TPGDA)⁽¹⁾ to provide a lower viscosity, easier handling product. EBECRYL 3700-25R exhibits low odor and fast cure response. Films of EBECRYL 3700-25R cured by ultraviolet light (UV) or electron beam (EB) demonstrate high gloss, high surface hardness, and the superior chemical resistance typical of an epoxy resin.

PERFORMANCE HIGHLIGHTS

EBECRYL 3700-25R is characterized by:

- Very fast cure response
- · Low odor

UV/EB cured products based on EBECRYL 3700-25R are characterized by the following performance properties:

- · High gloss
- Good chemical resistance
- Surface hardness

The final properties of UV/EB cured products also depend on the selection of other formulation components such as reactive diluents, additives and photoinitiators.

SUGGESTED APPLICATIONS

Formulated UV/EB curable products containing EBECRYL 3700-25R may be applied via direct or reverse roll, offset gravure, metering rod, slot die, knife over roll, air knife, curtain, immersion and spin coating methods, as well as offset and screen printing. EBECRYL 3700-25R is recommended for use in:

- Adhesives for paper lamination
- · Screen inks and coatings
- Lithographic inks
- Wood fillers
- · Overprint varnishes
- · Paper upgrading





VISCOSITY REDUCTION

Graph I shows the viscosity reduction of EBECRYL 3700-25R with 1,6-hexanediol diacrylate $(HDDA)^{(1)}$, isobornyl acrylate $(IBOA)^{(1)}$, trimethylolpropane triacrylate $(TMPTA)^{(1)}$, and tripropylene glycol diacrylate (TPGDA). Although viscosity reduction can be achieved with non-reactive solvents, reactive diluents are preferred because they are converted during UV/EB exposure to form a part of the coating or ink, thus reducing solvent emissions. The specific reactive diluents used will influence performance properties such as hardness and flexibility.

Graph II illustrates the change in viscosity of EBECRYL 3700-25R with increasing temperature.

PRECAUTIONS

Before using EBECRYL 3700-25R, see the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for information on the identified hazards of the material and the recommended personal protective equipment and procedures.

STORAGE AND HANDLING

Care should be taken not to expose the product to high temperature conditions, direct sunlight, ignition sources, oxidizing agents, alkalis or acids. This might cause uncontrollable polymerization of the product with the generation of heat. Storage and handling should be in stainless steel, amber glass, amber polyethylene or baked phenolic lined containers. Procedures that remove or displace oxygen from the material should be avoided. Do not store this material under an oxygen free atmosphere. Dry air is recommended to displace material removed from the container. Wash thoroughly after handling. Keep container tightly closed. Use with adequate ventilation.
